A technical opportunity

The following deal is from the finals of the recently finished Mavericks Premier League 2025. The four-member Polish team playing as Express Avenue was down 10-48 at the end of the first session against Formidables, arguably the strongest Open Team in India. In fact, in the last major event in the Indian Calendar, Formidables were head and shoulders above the rest of the team winning more than 18 VPs per round in the Swiss league.

In the Mavericks Premier League final though, the Polish quartet came from behind and won the match 118-110 after four sets. The results of the 2025 World Championships, the performance of the four-members-from-Poland team in the Indian events, and the performance of Mavericks who often field foreign players, is making us think that we are far behind others on the international stage. Is there at all a possibility that our players will perform well abroad is the question that is on everyone's mind.

The performance of the Indian teams certainly needs to improve. Many experts and veterans of Indian Bridge have their opinions about the ways and means to bring that about. We will try and pin down a few veterans and try to gauge their opinions in the upcoming issues of this bulletin.

I, for one, would like to think of technical opportunities. The deal below might suggest one. East opened 1Nt in the dealer position and the Polish North-South ended up in 2♠. The Formidables North-South also ended up in 2♠ in the Other Room. You can see from the diagram that a Spade game has excellent prospects for North-South. The question we should ask is whether the common defence against 1Nt is not geared to find such games because it is mainly geared to disturbing the 1Nt contract rather than looking for the best of the defending side. Is there a technical opportunity to devise or choose better defensive methods here? Will that provide us with some 'Alpha', to borrow a word from the investors? Are there more such areas?

That is the thought I would like to live you with.
