The **Phoenix Mixed Pairs** elimination concluded today after five crisp sessions of 10 boards each, producing a tightly contested leaderboard and a clear set of front-runners for tomorrow's finals. At the top of the table stand **Keyzad Anklesaria – Vidhya Patel**, who delivered consistent quality throughout to finish with an impressive **113.54**. In second place, the experienced duo of **Sailaja Tahiliani – Pradip Ghosh** closed strongly to post **85.42**, while **Vasanti Shah – Anirban Mitra** claimed third on **79.17** after a steady day's work.

In the Semifinals of the Ashok Ruia Senior Teams event, after two sessions **S D Associates and Cogito** are ahead in their respective matches.

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ASHOK RUIA SENIOR TEAMS

Swiss League

After the end of the seventh round of the Swiss league that was played on Wednesday morning, **S D Associates** finished miles clear of the field with an emphatic **107.48 VPs**, stamping their authority on the Senior Teams event. **Cogito** claimed second place on **86.23 VPs**, narrowly ahead of **Dr. S.S.S.M. (85.15 VPs)** and **Shree Cement (85.10 VPs)**, the two teams virtually inseparable on the final table.

The middle of the leaderboard was a battleground all evening, and **Easy Bridge** (81.93), **USBC** (75.70), and **Hemant Jalan** (75.29) held their nerve to secure comfortable qualifying spots. The last berth, however, went right down to the wire—**Juthika**, on **74.83 VPs**, clung on to eighth place by the slimmest of margins, edging out **Aristos** (73.05) and a tightly packed chasing group. The top eight teams advanced to the Quarterfinals. The full Swiss League rankings and the link to the results are available in the bulletin.

Quarterfinals

The Quarterfinals produced a mix of commanding victories and gritty contests. **S D Associates** delivered the day's most emphatic performance, overwhelming **USBC** with a powerhouse display across all three segments to win by a massive **124.5 – 39** margin. The Swiss League toppers barely put a foot wrong, dominating from the opening boards to the finish.

On the adjoining table, **Cogito** proved too steady and too accurate for **Juthika**, pulling ahead segment by segment before closing out a confident **63 – 49** win.

The upset of the round came courtesy of **Easy Bridge**, who stunned the higher-ranked finishers **Dr. S.S.S.M.** with a spectacular final segment. Trailing after the first 20 boards, Easy Bridge erupted with a **61–3** burst in Segment 3, flipping the match on its head for a dramatic **114 – 40** victory.

The tightest match unfolded between **Shree Cement** and **Hemant Jalan**, where momentum swung repeatedly. A late surge from Hemant Jalan in the final segment proved decisive, helping them edge through **83 – 76** after a superb recovery from their slow start.

Four teams now advance to the Semi-Finals — each carrying a very different story, but all with an eye on the Ashok Ruia Senior Teams title.

Semifinals

Two segments into the Semifinals, the picture is beginning to take shape — at least at one table. **S D Associates** have seized control of their match against **Hemant Jalan**, building steadily on their handsome carry-over to lead **58.5 – 38** after 20 boards. With their form holding strong across both segments, they will go into the final set with a comfortable cushion but still needing to close the deal.

At the second table, **Cogito** have been nothing short of dominant. Their sharp card play and accurate judgement have propelled them to a commanding **73 – 30** advantage over **Easy Bridge**, giving them a massive lead heading into the final stretch.

One segment remains — 20 boards that will determine who steps into the Ashok Ruia Senior Teams final.

The real reason why 6♦ failed

Examine the deal below and the results from 8 tables where the deal was played in the Quarter-Finals of the Ashok Ruia Senior Teams.

On three tables, the 6♦ contract went down. South had solid Diamonds; South is ruffing the second round of Spades; no opponent has a Club void; the ♥Queen is well-placed; and the ♣QJ are sitting under ♣AKT. Even the paranoid declarers won't miss a heartbeat on the issue of Heart finesse because if South removes trumps, cashes ♣AK, and ruffs a Club, and then proceeds to cash the remaining trumps, West will be squeezed in Hearts and Clubs and the ♥Q will show up when the Declarer plays ♥A and back. How on earth did the contract go down, and that too, on three tables?

You have to look elsewhere for the real reason behind the debacle. This was deal eleven, the very first deal after the lunch break. The following sweets were on the menu.



Semifinal, Set 1: S D Associates vs Hemant Jalan


S. D. Associates was clearly the dominating team of the Senior Teams event. They amassed 107.48 VPs in seven rounds in the Swiss league at a scoring rate of more than 15 VPs per round; and in the Quarterfinal, they trounced USBC 124.5-39. Hemant Jalan did not have a great run in the Swiss League. In the Quarterfinal, they just scraped through with an 83-75 IMP score. Formbook favoured S.D. Associates in the Semifinals.

For the first set, S.D. Associates fielded Sujit Bhattacharjee-Subir Mujumdar as North-South in the Open Room and Vijay Phatarpekar-R. Sridharan as East-West in the Closed Room. For Hemant Jalan team, Rajesh Dalal-Jitu Solani were West-East in the OR whereas Sukamal Das-Hemant Jalan were North-South in the Closed Room.

The first two boards of the first of three sets were uninteresting. The third produced a big swing for S.D. Associates. In the Open Room, Subir Mujumdar opened 1♠ and jumped to 3♠ over Sujit's 2♥ two-over-one response. Sujit cuebid 4♣, Jitu Solani doubled for lead, and Subir redoubled to show a first round control. RKC enquiry followed and North-South signed off in 6♠, a cold slam.



In the Closed Room, the bidding was brisk. After 1♠-2♥ uncontested first round, Hemant Jalan merely rebid 2♠, but on partner's slam-searching raise to 3♠, made amends for that slight underbid by jumping right away to six Spades. Holding a 14-pointer opposite a strong bidder, Sukamal decided to go for the moon, but that was a misjudgement. Two values, the ♣A in the North hand and the Club void in the South hand collided, got overcounted, so to say. The Grand Slam with an Ace out, in the hands of the Opening leader, meant Hemant Jalan team lost a packet of IMPs – 14 to be exact – on the board.



Boards five and six produced minor swings but board seven was the more interesting one. The bidding was the same at both the tables. South opened 1Nt and played there. Opening lead was the same - **♥Q**. In the Open Room, Subir went up with the **♥A**. Jitu unblocked **♥K** and ducked when Subir played a Diamond to **♦K** and then ducked the **♦J**, too. Subir now cashed out Spades claiming one down.

In the Closed Room, Hemant Jalan ducked **♥Q**. Sridharan overtook with **♥K** and backed a Heart. Phatarpekar played the **♥2** on that potentially signalling Club interest. Sridharan ducked a Diamond on the next trick. Hemant won. When he played the **♦J** next, Sridharan won **♦A** and pushed a Club fully trusting the count and the suit preference signals. East-West now collected four Hearts, four Clubs, and the **♦Ace** for down three and a gain of five IMPs.

On Board 9, Hemant Jalan team bounced back with a 12-IMP gain.

Open Room saw a sedate auction. Rajesh responded with a strong splinter bid in support of Jitu's 1♥ opening. With soft values, Sujit didn't bid 4♠ straightaway. Instead, he began with a double. Jitu's 4♥ bid closed the auction.

Sujit won the opening ♠Q lead with the ♠A and switched to a Club. That relieved the Declarer of a Club guess. Jitu made 10 tricks easily.

In the Closed Room, Sukamal Das added some spice to the auction. After East's 1♥ opening and South's 1♠ overcall, Phatarpekar bid 2Nt to show a strong hand with 4+ Hearts. Sukamal now bid 4♠ at favourable vulnerability. The onus was now on East-West to figure out whether they wanted to opt for penalising 4♠ or bid on to five level.

In a strong sequence like the one East-West had here, the idea of Forcing Pass would come into play. Sridharan's Pass here would be suggestive of an offensive hand signalling a willingness to play at five level. With a stiff Spade, Phatarpekar did just that. Five level was too high, and the contract went down one. Hemant Jalan earned 12 IMPs for that exciting 4♦ bid.
